3.	Rotherham Plan 6-monthly performance review

	Michael Holmes took the board through the performance data	
	scorecards and explained that they gave an overview of the	
	current position in the context of the Rotherham Plan (7 year	
	strategy). A number of indicators/measures are included per	
	game changer, together with an overall performance scorecard.	
	The indicators are drawn from existing plans and strategies,	

 together with a number of perception based survey measures. There are no specific targets - the aim is to gauge progress/direction of travel against a baseline broadly taken in March 2017. Michael took the Board through the measures for each game changer, points raised included: Building stronger communities Hate crime reporting has increased, however the indicator is below the baseline. Further work is required to look at these figures in more detail, and potentially compare to other geographical areas. Rob Odell to circulate a note giving further detail The potential impact of Brexit on communities – CEO Group are looking at this and gathering intelligence to predict impact on services Michael agreed to find out when the next IMD survey is due to be carried out Skills and employment Indicator SE3 will need to be amended as it is no longer possible to track NEET figures deteriorated, however may be showing seasonal variances and more useful to compare annually Further positive promotion of apprenticeships should be undertaken – school enterprise advisors are now in place Presentation on the new Workplace Wellbeing Charter at the next meeting Integrated health and social care Michael to confirm when the 18/19 figures are released for IHSC3 91 days discharge figures 	Action: Michael Action: Michael Action: Michael

University Centre Rotherham Jana Checkley, Director of Higher Education and Skills, University Centre Rotherham delivered a presentation which updated the	

 board on the newly opened UCR. The main points included: 420 students enrolled to date (target 669) with courses starting next week Rotherham is 10% below the national average for level 4 qualifications – UCR to play a vital role in closing this gap and upskilling the workforce 36 courses currently available with an additional 20 by 2025, and 1000 learners The curriculum will continue to be developed alongside the needs of local employers Degrees will be accredited by Sheffield Hallam or Hull universities Questions/comments followed. Jana confirmed that the majority of staff at UCR had been recruited mostly from local areas. It is not yet known whether students from outside of Rotherham are applying to study at UCR (there are no current plans for residential units). There are currently no plans to expand science-based courses such as pharmacy/dentistry as there are not enough lower-level students who would wish to progress onto these courses. Jana confirmed that community facilities were available at UCR – with a large seminar room seating 120 people. Rob Odell confirmed that he had assigned a dedicated officer to the UCR.
Joint council/police teams Rob Odell updated the board on progress to date with the joint council/police teams. The dedicated neighbourhood teams have been reinstated and new joint enforcement teams have been established. The teams are operating out of the following locations: • Central – Riverside
 North – Rawmarsh South – Maltby These teams will feed into the multi-agency groups (MAGs). Rob shared a couple of case studies which highlighted the effectiveness of the new joint way of working. Rob confirmed that data protection issues have been overcome. Rob offered a meeting with his 3 chief inspectors and Adrian Dexter to look at how faith and community groups can help in creating long-term tenancies (particularly with private landlords).

	Town Centre Tim O'Connell updated the board on progress to date with the Town Centre Masterplan and new developments. Tim explained that it was no longer realistic to expect a retail-led regeneration of the town centre. The aim is to encourage more people to live in the town centre and to create a leisure/family-friendly offer at Forge Island. Tim confirmed that Muse Development had recently been appointed as developers of the site. Tim reassured the board that there were plans to incorporate high quality public realm and green spaces and for the river/canal side to become an asset. Rob Odell offered his specialist officers to assist in 'designing out' crime during the development process. Cultural Strategy Polly Hamilton, Assistant Director, Culture, Sport and Tourism delivered a presentation on the Cultural Strategy.
