1.	Notes from the previous meeting, declarations of interest and

	Cmmr Stella Manzie gave apologies for the Leader, Cllr Chris	
	Read and confirmed that she would chair the meeting in his	
	absence. Cmmr Manzie welcomed everyone to the meeting,	
	and introductions followed.	
	Additional apologies were noted as above.	
	There were no declarations of interest.	
	The notes of the previous meeting were accepted as a true	
	record.	
2.	Rotherham Together Partnership new logo – presentations	
	from Rotherham College students	
	The partnership team have recently been working with students	
	from Rotherham College to develop a new logo for Rotherham	
	Together Partnership. The students worked to a brief supplied	
	by RTP, and each delivered a short presentation, explaining the	
	concept behind their designs. Cmmr Stella Manzie thanked the	
	students for their hard work, and the RTP members were given	
	an opportunity to select their favourite designs. The top three	
	designs will be discussed at the CEO Group meeting on Thursday	
	3 rd December, where a final design will be selected. Once the	
	design has been chosen it will be circulated to the RTP members.	CH/KR
3.	The new vision for Rotherham/Community strategy discussion	
	and presentation	
	Cmmr Manzie explained that in the absence of the Chair, she	
	would take the group through agenda item 3 and 4 together.	
	Carole Haywood delivered a brief presentation (which was	
	circulated to the group) outlining the development process for	
	the community strategy to date. This included the consultation	
	process which identified the top three priorities for the public	
	and business (from the Views from Rotherham consultation)	
	feedback from both the initial RTP meeting and 1:1's with	
	partners. Theme boards have also identified a number of 'whole	
	partnership' issues including:	
	Smoking/tobacco control	
	 Mental health and emotional well-being 	
	 The town centre 	
	 Creating the right environment for work 	
	 Community cohesion 	
	Carole outlined a number of challenges/improvements which	
	could be 'collectively adopted' by the partnership which could	

be summarised as four key themes:	
Improvements to the environment	
 Improvement of people's mental and emotional health and well-being 	
 Provision of opportunities for people to become 'work ready' 	
 Improvement of community relations 	
Carole posed a number of questions to the group regarding their	
thoughts on the strategy, its main priorities and short/long term actions. Questions/discussion followed.	
Cmmr Manzie posed a number of questions to the group, including:	
 Do we want to focus on all four big themes? 	
 What actions would we like to take forward, or mobilise others to do/support with? 	
Cmmr Manzie added that community cohesion remains a big	
issue in Rotherham, however the Safer Rotherham Partnership	
will have responsibility for addressing this and some of the more recent challenges.	
The group broke up into three smaller groups to focus on discussing the themes and proposals/ideas for action.	
Carole Haywood <u>agreed</u> to summarise the actions/developing	
ideas in an email the group to ascertain which issues/areas	
people are interested in developing further for the strategy. The	СН
notes from the discussion groups are attached at <i>appendix 1</i> .	
Cmmr Manzie asked that the group consider what their vision is	
for Rotherham in 5 years' time, and agreed to contact Bradford	Cmmr
to discuss regeneration initiatives.	Manzie
The group agreed not to duplicate efforts where task groups	
have already been formed, or work is underway, but to add	
value where possible. In addition the Leader has already	
initiated some conversations with communities, and this work	
could be further developed and brought back to the RTP for	
discussion.	
Lisa Pogson confirmed that the Chamber of Commerce is	LP/CH
developing a 'good news' website about Rotherham, and agreed	
to arrange for a demonstration of this at a future meeting.	
Cllr Kath Sims suggested that partners who already have	

newsletters could share them across organisations.	
 The group <u>agreed</u> to receive an update from the supporting boards at the next meeting, to include: Information on regeneration activity Quick wins/actions 	CH/Theme Leads
AOB Community Strategy launch Carole Haywood confirmed that the launch event for the partnership and the plan is confirmed for the 17 th March 2016.	
New RMBC Chief Executive Cmmr Manzie informed the group that the new RMBC Chief Executive, Sharon Kemp has been appointed and will start on the 1 st February. She is keen to meet with partners and will be working in Rotherham for one day per week between now and the 18 th January.
